This guide will lead you to Reference materials, books, journals, magazines, newspapers, associations, internet resources & government documents available through the Library's holdings, services and databases. It will also direct you to on-line locations of full-text journals. As always, carefully evaluate all sources before you choose to integrate them into your papers, assignments and presentations.

Terrorism is a broad term covering acts of terrorism, international offences, political violence, bombings, hostages and other areas. This guide will help provide general information that will be helpful in the beginning stages of research. If you have a very specific topic in mind, consult more specific subject guides that more closely examine your chosen area.

Reference Books

Bibliographies & Directories

Bibliographies are an excellent starting point when trying to find good books and prominent authors in a certain field.

In one volume, all the essential tools are provided with an overview of the topic, chronology of events, glossary, biographical listing and a fully annotated bibliography.

Global Terrorism (2004)—REF 303.6 H496g

The text addresses terrorism at home and abroad, providing a general perspective and update on terrorism with recent events and publications.

Terrorism (2001)—REF 303.6 H496t 2001

Given the variety of information included in this reference book, and the way it is presented, it can be considered an almanac. The text provides a survey of the topic, a chronology, a biographical section, glossary as well as a directory of organizations and agencies involved with terrorism.

Ecoterrorism (2004)—REF 303.6 L848e

This text provides clear and essential information needed to define, understand and research this subject. It is a useful *reference source for all interested in ecoterrorism and environmental issues.*

Encyclopedias & Dictionaries

They offer a way to quickly explore various aspects of acts of terrorism, historical events, terrorist organizations, methods of terrorism, and whatever other terms you might choose to investigate. They also provide bibliographies and reading lists for further research

Encyclopedia of Terrorism (2003)—REF 303.6 K97e 2003

Latest in the genre of reference works, this well-constructed volume (begun one year prior to September 11, 2001) provides historical and contemporary coverage of a complex and politically timely subject.

Encyclopedia of Crime & Justice (1983)—REF 364.03 E56k

This encyclopedia covers a wide range of criminal and judicial topics ranging from abortion to wiretapping, but elements of terrorism and terrorist acts are covered also. The essays, 800 to 12,000 words in length, cover topics broadly.
